As Managing Director of M. R. Hornibrook Pty. Ltd. Brisbane, from 1926 his company constructed many notable engineering works in Australia — large bridges, power houses, industrial factories, underwater tunnels, harbour works and large city buildings, and made several original contributions to civil engineering practice.

He was awarded many honours for his contributions to Master Builders' Federation of Australia, Queensland Master Builders' Association, Australian Institute of Building, Queensland Civil Engineering Contractors Association, and Administration of Golf in Queensland.

For the inspiration he has provided to the growth of Australia by demonstrating that the highest position in industry, commerce and education can be attained by hard work and the will to succeed. For demonstrating to Australians that as individuals, ambition, motivation and ability are the true keys to learning.

The History of the Hornibrook Tournament

EXTRACTS FROM EXECUTIVE COUNCIL
2nd-3rd JULY, 1959

GOLFING TOURNAMENT,
MELBOURNE, 20th-21st JULY, 1959 —

Resolved:

"That the States be circularised by Federation regarding individual contributions toward a suitable trophy for this M. R. Hornibrook Golfing Tournament and that this matter be taken up in each State by the Federal delegates; that a maximum

target of £25 from each of the six main States be aimed at and that the moneys be forwarded to the Executive Director; that any surplus over the cost of the trophy be used to supply small replicas; that the President, the Executive Director and Mr. Wal Morris of Victoria be authorised to select a first class trophy to the value of approximately £150 and that steps be taken to secure this trophy as soon as possible without waiting for the individual contributions to be submitted."

25th-26th FEBRUARY, 1960

PAYMENTS TO M. R. HORNIBROOK
GOLFING TOURNAMENT TROPHY —

It was reported that all States had now made their contributions. It was left to the President and Director to ascertain the correct procedure to be followed regarding the nomenclature to be adopted with respect to this Tournament consequent upon a knighthood having been granted Sir Manuel.

Report of the First Tournament

VICTORIAN BUILDERS WIN
FIRST INTERSTATE GOLF MATCH

The first interstate golf tournament for the M. R. Hornibrook Trophy was held in Melbourne on July 20 and 21st. The outstanding success of this inaugural function has assured a continuance of the event, which will in time have the same significance to the builder golfers as the James Wall Tournament has to the bowlers of the industry.

Teams from South Australia and New South Wales joined the Victorians in a three way match which was played over 27 holes at Kingswood Golf Course on Monday the 20th and a further 27 holes at the Commonwealth Club on the Tuesday.

At the conclusion of play at Commonwealth a buffet dinner arranged by the Victorian Association was attended by all participants and some additional Victorians who held their monthly golf day in conjunction with the interstate match.

The President of the Master Builders' Federation of Australia, Mr. Jack McDougall, welcomed the visitors and called upon Manual Hornibrook, whose name has become synonymous with building in Australia, to present the cup which bears his name.

In presenting the Trophy, Mr. Hornibrook said that the event, by bringing together as it did, Builders from all over Australia, who in the friendly rivalry of sport would make

new and enduring friendships would be of great value to the Industry. Mr. Phil Ireland, President of the Victorian Master Builders' Association accepted the Cup on behalf of the Victorian players.

Results of the Competition —

Additional trophies were given for the best individual score over 54 holes, this being won by G. Eastment of N.S.W. with 103 Stableford points, for the best scores on each day's play, Ron Peake scored South Australia's only success by leading the field at Kingswood with 51 points while Wally Morris from Victoria won the event at Commonwealth also with 51 points.

To Wal Morris and his band of organisers/chauffeurs who included Jack McCann, Frank Hill, Jack McDougall, Harold McKern, with apologies for any omissions, goes a vote of thanks for a job well done.

The tournament next year will be held in Adelaide and it is hoped that teams will be coming from Queensland, Western Australia and Tasmania and so make a truly interstate match.

The Adelaide contingent was honoured by the Vice-President of the Association wishing them well at the Adelaide airport (or did the Victorian footballers get you there Bob?). A. W. (Bert) Baulderstone Captain/Manager of the team did a good job of keeping himself fit enough to get the players up in the morning. Thanks Bert for giving up your time and so ably looking after us.

Most consistent player from South Australia was Doug. Omond, also scoring well and incidentally winning the sweepstakes were Ron Peake, Frank Crowle and Merv. Warner.

With the golf over, the players were joined by a further contingent from Adelaide, who flew over on the Wednesday for an interesting and educational day's tour of the C.S.I.R.O., arranged by the S.A. Section of the Institute of Builders.

The "M. R. Hornibrook" Cup

1958: It was a happy thought which prompted A. W. (Bert) Baulderstone in May, 1958 to request the South Australian Association to place on the Agenda for the 1958 Convention in Perth the idea of an annual Golf Tournament between States.

Convention approved, requesting interested States to appoint delegates and confer. Subject to fruition it was resolved to call the Tournament the "M. R. Hornibrook Tournament". Victoria was requested to arrange a Golf Week as a trial, future action to be determined by the interest in, and success of the trial week.

1959: Victoria fulfilled their obligation by arranging a competition in June 1959. Victoria, New South Wales and South Australia were the contestants. The Tournament was an immediate success, its future being assured. Victoria were the victors and became the first holders of the magnificent cup.

1960: Adelaide was the venue in 1960, where three matches were played and the local team were the winners.

1961: The scene shifted to Sydney in 1961 where we saw New South Wales and Newcastle, as a combined team, take off the Cup.

1962: In 1962 Queensland entered the Tournament, staged in Melbourne, and the Victorian team again won.

1963: The Tournament was held in Brisbane, Newcastle as independent members of the Federation were represented and became serious contenders for the Cup. Here again Victoria proved too strong for the opposition.

1964: A return to Adelaide. The traditional spirit of the Tournament was further augmented by keen competition,

the advancement of goodwill and the cementing of old and new friendships. Victoria won again.

1965: Sydney was the venue for the 1965 Tournament and much was done by N.S.W. to further augment the new and old friendships of the past. They even won the Cup and made it known they would be hard to beat next year.

1966: A return to Melbourne saw the Victorians win the Cup on their home courses with several States hot on their heels. This year saw participation by a Tasmanian contingent for the first time.

1967: Newcastle held the Tournament for the first time, and in so doing set a target hard to surpass. It also created another first by winning the Cup.

1968: The host State was Queensland. A fine week was had on the "Gold Coast" but the southerners from Adelaide proved too good for the Sunshine States.

1969: A return to Adelaide where the spirit of the Tournament was again renewed. Keen competition and renewed friendships were the order of the day. The cup was retained by South Australia.

1970: Back to Sydney. Again the usual hospitality was extended. A sadder note this year being the death of Sir Manuel. The Cup was won by Sydney, N.S.W.

1971: Newcastle was the venue and their splendid hospitality proved too much for all but the Victorians who were proud to win the coveted trophy.

1972: Victoria was the host State. After stealing a march on the first day, the South Australians held off all opposition and took the Cup back to Adelaide.

1973: Tasmania held the tournament for the first time. Hobart was the venue and the Casino a big attraction. Sydney recorded their fourth win.

1974: Queensland were hosts and the competition was again held at the Gold Coast. They are to be congratulated on their first win and a most successful tournament.

1975: Adelaide were hosts again and were successful once more. Competition was very keen. A good time was had by all.

1976: New South Wales was host again. As always, old friendships were renewed. We played on top courses and with local knowledge and good golf the N.S.W. team came out the victors.

1977: Newcastle, the ever-popular host, did a great job and capped it off by a very narrow win.

1978: Victoria hosted yet another fine tournament and competition was very close. Sydney recorded their sixth win.

1979: Tasmania hosted their second tournament in Hobart and celebrated the 21st Anniversary of the "Hornibrook" by recording their first ever win.

1980: South Australia are honoured to again be hosts and wish all participants good golfing and good fellowship.

1981: Queensland hosted a great week of hospitality on the Gold Coast. Congratulations and best wishes to South Australia, who were this year's winners.

1982: New South Wales did a magnificent job of organising this tournament but unfortunately the weather let them down, it poured down each golf day but they received some compensation for their efforts by winning the Cup.

A message from MBFA President

In 1958 at the MBFA Convention in Perth it was agreed the MBFAV would endeavour to arrange a golfing week the following year. There was a small proviso. If it was a success then it would be a regular feature each year.

The Convention further agreed that the tournament would be known as the M. R. Hornibrook Golfing Tournament to honour one of Australia's best known builders and in recognition of the tremendous contribution Manuel Hornibrook (later Sir Manuel Hornibrook) had given to the industry.

I understand the first tournament went ahead after many doubts, fears and trepidations with 21 visitors taking on the Victorian team.

The then MBFA Executive Director Lin Dudley wrote of the event "the inaugural M. R. Hornibrook Golfing Tournament was staged last Monday and Tuesday and was a complete success. Melbourne turned on its customary superb winter weather, providing two days of glorious sunshine and the courses were in perfect condition".

He continued: "Victoria managed to swindle the other States of N.S.W. and South Australia out of the trophy, and generally the whole tournament, which was attended by Manuel Hornibrook who presented the trophy, was noted a very fine event."

Since that eventful week in 1959 the M. R. Hornibrook Tournament has developed into an event looked forward to by all member players who have experienced the bright, festive and friendly occasion.

Last year one hundred and sixty-five players took part.

All of us at MBFA extend best wishes for a very successful 25th anniversary tournament in Newcastle.



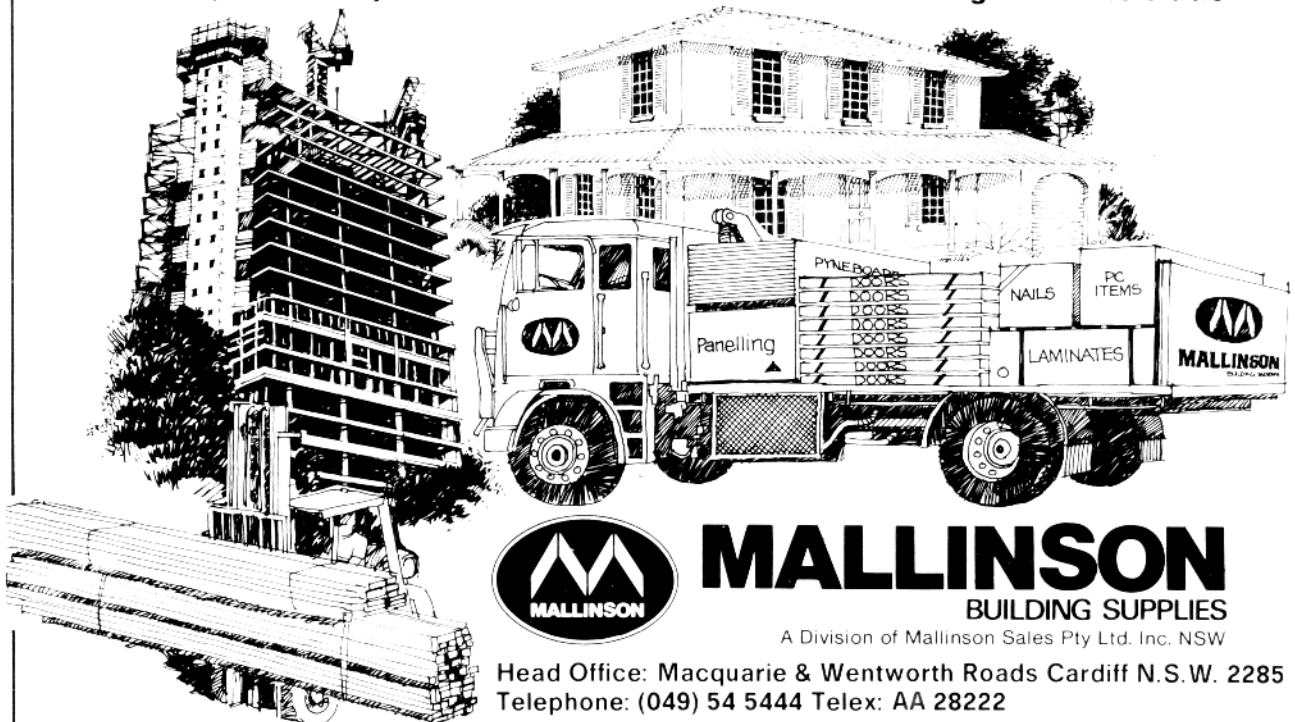

History of the Newcastle MBA Social Golf Club

It was 1961 when Newcastle competed in the fourth M. R. Hornibrook Tournament in Sydney, playing in a combined team with the N.S.W.M.B.A. Our numbers were not sufficient to compete as a Newcastle team, however it was felt that as we were a member of the Federation, Newcastle was entitled to compete independently.

1963 saw a team of Brian Compton, Reg Parker, John Pickles, Tony De Martin and Neville Hines front up at Brisbane requesting that they be allowed to play in the Tournament as a Newcastle team. After a meeting attended by all States, this was finally agreed to, as Newcastle had an identity within the Federation. The minimum number for a team was set at 5 which was subsequently changed the next year to a minimum of 8. We had now set the foundations for the formation of a Social Golf Club within the Newcastle Master Builders' Association.

At a General Meeting of the Association held in the original

Master Builders' Association rooms, 27 King Street, Newcastle in February, 1964 the Social Golf Club was formed.

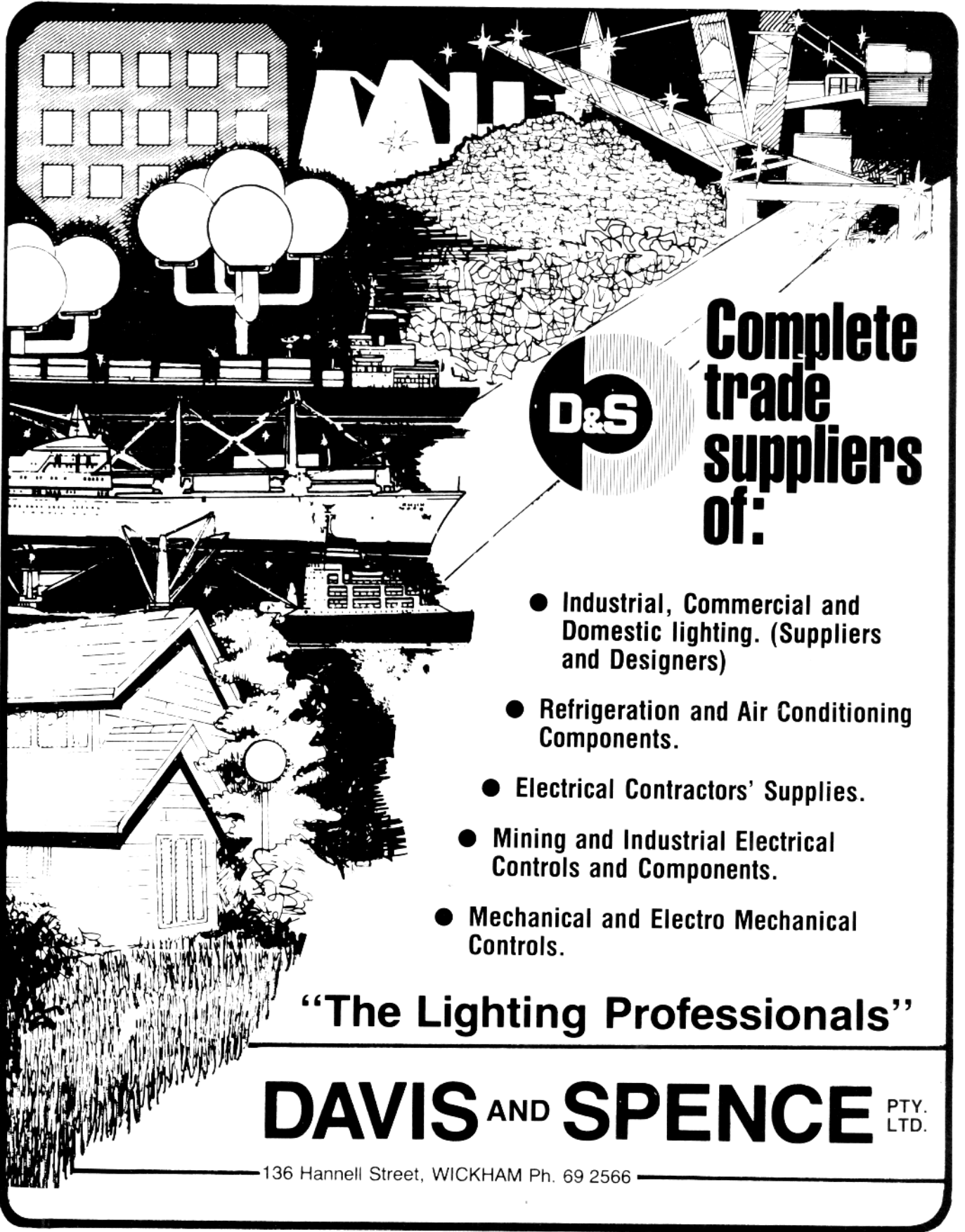
Approximately 40 members indicated that they would participate

in a monthly mid week game of golf and a committee was formed.

The Executive being President — Brian Compton, Captain — Reg Parker, and Secretary — John Pickles were elected, and set about

organising a yearly programme. A Constitution was formed which included the requirements as laid down by the Newcastle Master Builders' Association.

The success of the Golf Club and its operation has been due in no small part to the efforts of the Foundation Executive, the President, Captain and Secretary, and they have remained unchanged up to this date.

During this time the Golf Club has been actively engaged in the promotion of Golf on a once a month, mid week basis, and now boasts of between 80 and 90 members, made up from all sections of the building industry. The Constitution as framed is strictly adhered to as far as participation is concerned, and this allows builders, exchange members, engineers, and architects, and those people directly associated with the building industry to participate. The Rules of the Constitution calls for the Executive to be builder members of the Association. This ensures that the Club is always controlled by the Master Builders' Association, and sees that all standards are strictly maintained in accordance with Master Builders' Association Policy.

A sub-committee of members and players is formed to conduct events such as the M. R. Hornibrook Tournament. We encourage members who have retired to still participate in our monthly matches as honorary members, thereby keeping in touch with the many friends made during their working life in the building industry. We are affiliated with the Newcastle District Golf Association. By this action our members are governed by the Rules of Golf with the membership of a recognised Golf Club being a most important requirement.

We have enjoyed regular participation by members at our monthly matches. To swell our numbers we have instigated, from the inception, the feeling that all visitors are welcome. We run a separate competition for these people and in doing so, we now rate as one of the largest mid week Social Golf Clubs in Newcastle. It is not uncommon to see 120 to 130 players hitting off at our matches and many

visitors follow the programme around the different courses.

Our club is most grateful for the generous support of the sponsors who have provided trophies for our competitions since the clubs formation.

Our A. B. and C. Grade Championships, over two rounds, is the most sought after. These winners' names take pride of place on the Championship Board, situated in the Associations' Auditorium.

Run in conjunction with this is a nett score aggregate over the two days. No winner or runner-up may receive more than one trophy.

Tournament State Delegates Meeting at Newcastle — 27-5-83.

A Singles Knock Out Competition is also run during the year with a qualifying round being conducted in February, and the resultant 32 players playing matches through the year, with the Final usually played in November.

Our Teams event run over 4 matches during the year is another hotly contested major trophy. It consists of a draw of three players, with the best two scores of the team on each day being recorded, with the highest aggregate score at the end of the games being the winner.

Our major event is a Dinner in November, with a Presentation of Trophies. Guests are invited among whom are the Principal of the Building Technical College and our Apprentice Scholarship Winner, who relates his weeks' construction experience to all those present.

Our last game in December is an Ambrose event which fosters further fellowship amongst members and concludes with a Christmas Dinner.

Several other events are also widely accepted on our Calendar and these include an Annual Match against our exchange members, with a Smorgasbord Dinner in conjunction.

The other event which has now grown to a major day, is a competition between the Sydney M.B.A. and is usually held half way between the two centres at Gosford. P.G.H. Bricks have taken this up as a major sponsor and trophies to the value of \$500 are competed for on this day. Travel is usually by coach, and a dinner is held after play in

Gosford. It is anticipated this year that the event will be held at the Monash Golf Club in Sydney's northern suburbs.

Our participation in the Hornibrook tournament has now resulted in the Newcastle side being one of the largest contingents. Following the recent ruling that players will be limited to 25 from each State. It has been necessary for the Executive to go through a selection process to determine our representative team. This has further cemented our Club, as one of the considerations for selection is that the members must participate in the monthly matches.

We have conducted three successful Hornibrooks in 1967, 1971 and 1977, and we have been given the opportunity of conducting the Silver

Anniversary Competition in 1983. We hope this will be the third time Newcastle has won the coveted trophy.

As a service to the industry we participate in a Travel Scholarship in conjunction with the five district Technical Colleges. The Top Third Year Student from each of the five Colleges in the area are selected by their respective teachers. The students, five of them, are then interviewed by the Golf Club Executive, and the Scholarship Winner decided.

Through the participation in the Hornibrook Tournament and the friends gained over the years, we are then able to place the boy in a State of his choice for a weeks educational training. This allows the boy to gain valuable experience whilst observing his choice of construction in another State.

We take this opportunity of again thanking our interstate friends for their acceptance of this very worthwhile travel Scholarship, and look forward to the time that we may respond to the request of another State that takes up this type of learning, for up and coming builders of the future.

We see our Golf Club and the Hornibrook Competition as a major source of bringing together builders, suppliers, sub contractors, architects, engineers, etc., to enjoy good company and sportsmanship, and at the same time promoting good will within the Industry.

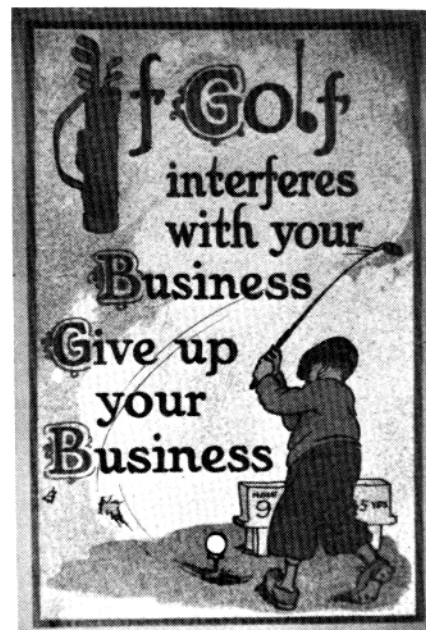

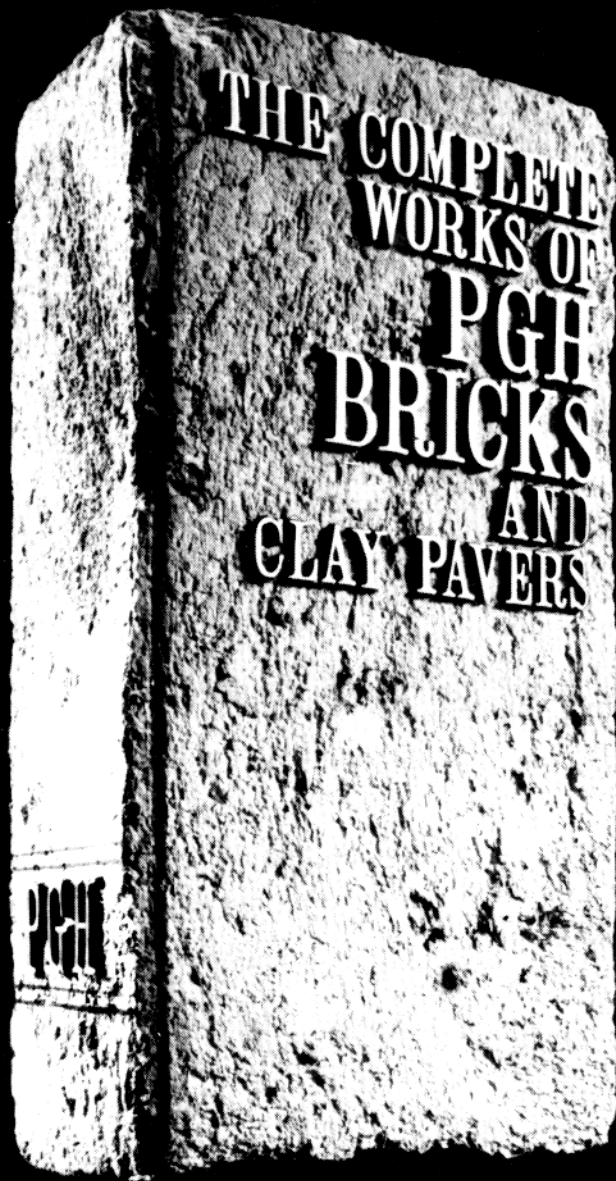
